London rail trio coming to fruition

On a scale of active Railfuture campaigning, the three range from actively engaged to passively observing!



The latter first, namely the new southbound platform and concourse at London Underground's Northern line Bank station, which opened to passengers on Monday 16 May, has been a project which we've been aware of and welcomed but not been actively engaged with.

The second, what was Crossrail operated by TfL Rail and became the Elizabeth line on Tuesday 24 May, although still in three separate services, has had one of the longest-running rail development histories. Members of Railfuture and its predecessors in title have played a role in championing its cause across the decades it's taken to (nearly) complete the project.

Last but by no means least and also in late-May, the Barking Riverside Extension has carried its first London Overground train on test. Railfuture has actively supported the development of this project, in particular with our consultation responses in June 2015 and October 2016, and attendance at the Public Inquiry later in October 2016 to examine unresolved objections to the application for an Order under the Transport & Works Act.




- ~ on the 23rd, Heathrow Airport Junction <> Heathrow Terminal 4 via Terminals 1, 2 & 3, in 1998

- ~ contributed to an alternate-monthly meeting of the Uckfield Railway Line Parishes Committee.
- ~ held regular online meetings of our Eastern, Herts & Beds and Sussex & Coastway Divisions, plus an inperson meeting of our Kent Division in Faversham to coincide with the Faversham Transport Festival.
- ~ contributed to an online meeting of Transport for the South East's Transport Forum reviewing the process for consultation on the draft Strategic Investment Plan.
- ~ held regional Branch committee meetings online.

Also during May, regional branch committee has:

~ noted Lewes District Council's Planning Committee's rejection of a fourth application for outline planning permission in part of the gap between Ringmer and Broyle Side, for up to 68 homes on the same site as was refused by members last year for up to 97 homes.

Accessible stations to improve inclusivity

<u>DfT's nationwide station accessibility audit</u> has passed 1000 of the over 2500 stations in Britain, and is due to complete by March 2023, a year before the start of Control Period 7 and additional Access for All funding.
