- ~ 12<sup>th</sup>, in 1986 passenger services resume between Kensington Olympia and WCML via Willesden.
- ~ 13<sup>th</sup>, in 1985 Homerton station.
- ~ 14<sup>th</sup>, in 1979 passenger services resume between Camden Road and Stratford, to/from North Woolwich.
- ~ 14th, in 1979 West Ham Low Level station.
- ~ 14th, in 1984 Bedford St. Johns station.
- ~ 15th, in 2016 Lea Bridge station.
- ~ 16<sup>th</sup>, in 1988 through passenger services resume between Farringdon and Blackfriars stations.
- ~ 17th, in 1982 Watton-at-Stone station.
- ~ 17<sup>th</sup>, in 1983 Dalston Kingsland station.
- ~ 23<sup>rd</sup>, in 2010 New Cross Gate Down Junction, for through Overground services between Dalston Junction and Crystal Palace / West Croydon stations.
- ~ 24<sup>th</sup>, in 2022 Elizabeth Line's Abbey Wood, Canary Wharf, Custom House, Farringdon, Liverpool Street, Paddington, Tottenham Court Road, Whitechapel, Woolwich stations.
- ~ 25<sup>th</sup>, in 1998 Heathrow Central and Heathrow T4 stations, and the link from Airport Junction.
- ~ 29<sup>th</sup>, in 1990 St Paul's, now City, Thameslink station.
- ~ 29<sup>th</sup>, in 1994 Mitre Bridge Curve (WLL<>NLL) and Sheepcote Lane Curve (SWML <> WLL).
- ~ 30th, in 1995 Chafford Hundred station.
- $\sim 30^{\text{th}}$ , in 1999 West Ham High Level station and West Brompton station mainline platforms.
